

NEW STAMPS ON THE APULUM POTTERY PRODUCTS

SUMMARY

This study presents a couple of ceramic materials making part of the *instrumentum* category, discovered during the last years in *Apulum* two urban centers territories. There are commented two greek inscriptions on amphorae handles produced, during the roman period by Greek workshops, two building materials — *tegulae* — belonging to an individual workman, unknown until now, who used to sell his products in *Colonia Aurelia Apulensis* territory, and, at least, a vase with a latin inscription (maybe an anthroponimus).

These new discoveries, interesting by their original informations are dated back from the IInd to the IIIrd c. A.D.
