

**“ANTON TRIEST COLLECTION”.  
MEDIEVAL AND MODERN COINS, IN THE U.N.M. OF ALBA IULIA**

**SUMMARY**

This study presents “Anton Triest Collection” which has been obtained in two stages: the first part in June 1967 and the second part in September 1967 - the Rumanians coins. Here we are concerned with medieval and modern coins which represent the first part of Collection.

By the composition analysis of A. Triest the Collection we see there are included emissions of Hungarian kings beginning with Stefan I and ending with Wladislaw II, from 11 century until to the beginning of 16<sup>th</sup> century.

Those ones are present not only with 1 - 2 coins, because the collector gathered not only monetary types but also their variants.

In large number we find emissions of Austrians Empires as kings of Hungary from Ferdinand I until M. Teresia including the period from the beginning 16<sup>th</sup> century to the middle 18<sup>th</sup> century.

In that same period from the beginning to the end of the 16<sup>th</sup> century we find the Polish emissions starting with Sigismund I and concluding with I. Cazimir, the pieces from 1/2 gros until the pieces of 1 ort.

This collection has been completed by the 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> centuries emissions of Transilvanian princes from the mints of Baia Mare, Alba Iulia and Hungary.

By the end of 17<sup>th</sup> century until the 19<sup>th</sup> century is the largest number of coins are 100 Austrian emissions from Leopold I until Francisc Ioseph I, bronze and silver coins coming from the imperial mints.

In conclusion the merit of A. Triest was to create a collection of coins which were in circulation in Transylvanian principality and as he was more experienced in the valuables patrimonial, he offered a picture of the coins which were in circulation in Transylvania and, in another way, he completed our knowledge regarding this documentary and historical values.
