

ROMANIAN COUNCILS AND NATIONAL GUARD IN THE APUSENI MOUNTAINS
UNPUBLISHED DOCUMENTS
(NOVEMBER-DECEMBER 1918)

SUMMARY

A well-known fact, the Apuseni Mountains and their inhabitants called "moși" played an exceptional part in the history of the struggle for freedom and national unity of the Romanian in Transylvania.

On the other hand, a number of papers showed that the Romania councils and national guards set up in the autumn of 1918 played an essential part in directing the national energies towards the major ideal of Transylvanian's unification with Romania, and its consolidation after ward.

The above-mentioned circumstances can but enhance the historians interes in the content of the present study as the refers exactly to councils and national guard in a territory that covers a great deal of the Apuseni's area, then included in the district of the former county of Turda-Arieș.

Dealng with the setting-up of the above-mentioned temporary authorities of the local Romania power and ther varied activity from november-december 1918, the present study, undoubtedly, gains in interes and valuea by the fact that 21 unpublished documents discovered in the "Leading Council" fund, kept at the states Archives, in Bucharest are also reproduced.
