

## A ROMAN MILITARY GRAVE AT APVLUM

### (SUMMARY)

The article presents a Roman grave discovered in one of the cemeteries from Alba Iulia (ancient *Apulum*), located in the place called "Stația de Salvare" and excavated between 1981-1985. The cremation grave no.19 from trench XXXII had rich grave goods, consisting of a bronze ring buckle (*"ringschnallencingulum"*), two bronze fungiform studs, an openwork rectangular mount, fragments of a letter-shaped mount, two bronze strap terminals, a T-shaped brooch and a coin of Faustina II. Part of the objects are typical for the military equipment of the IIIrd century AD. A complete English version of this article will be published in the next number of "Bibliotheca Musei Apvlensis".
